

These are the key regulations for performers, teachers and families.

Please read carefully before entering. Full regulations are available online.

#### Eligibility

- Open to amateur performers only, except Recital Class and bona fide choir members.
- Teachers with professional qualifications may enter if not earning income from performance.
- · Age limits as of 20 January 2026.
- Duologue entries are placed in the class of the eldest performer.
- A solo performer may appear only once in any solo class.
- Recital Class performances are not eligible for Musician of the Year.

#### **Entries and Copyright**

- Original copies of all music/text must be used in performance.
- One copy must be provided for the adjudicator (photocopies permitted for this purpose only).
- Entry Forms must include Own Choice titles.
  - These cannot be changed after 31 January 2026.
- The same Own Choice/set piece cannot be repeated in another class.
- Explicit language/content must be declared on the Entry Form with full text provided.
   The Festival may reject unsuitable material.
- Closing dates:
  - Music/Drama: 20th January 2026
  - Photography/Art: 2nd March 2026
- Late entries will not be accepted.

#### **Accompanists and Backing Tracks**

- Performers may bring their own accompanist or use the official accompanist (£4 per class, declared at entry).
- Music for the official accompanist must be sent to the Music Co-ordinator via the online entry system.
- Backing tracks must be sent electronically (MP3 or WAV) via the online entry system at least three weeks before the festival.
- Where a backing track is used, providing a copy of the music or lyrics for the adjudicator is optional but not required. The overall performance will be adjudicated.

#### Festival Arrangements

- The Committee decides class order. Timings may change.
- If not present when called, the right to compete is lost.
- · Adjudicator's decisions are final.
- Remark sheets are available immediately after each class.
- Do not approach the Adjudicator directly. Speak to the Adjudicator's Secretary or a Festival Officer.
- Trophies are held for one year and must be returned clean and on time. Loss or damage may result in liability for repair/replacement.

#### **Performance Conditions**

- Time limits are strictly enforced. The adjudicator may stop adjudicating once the limit
  is reached.
- · No prompting from the audience is allowed.
- No rehearsal space is provided. Large groups may be given a holding room.

#### Refunds

- Fees are refunded only if a requested day/session cannot be fulfilled.
- · Withdrawals within three weeks of the festival forfeit the fee.
- No refunds for non-attendance.

#### **Health and Safety**

- Please state any medical conditions or accessibility needs on the Entry Form.
- In an emergency, report to a Festival Official or the ticket desk.
- All attendees remain responsible for their own property; the Festival accepts no liability for loss or damage.

Peter Dayson has spent over 50 years working in the theatre as a producer, director, actor and writer. His career has taken him all over the country and beyond, giving him the chance to perform in plays, musicals and television, as well as create and direct shows of his own. Above all, Peter has always kept a great love for the industry and the people in it.

He started out in repertory theatre, performing with companies in Manchester, Nottingham, Bath, Swansea and many more. Along the way, he has played a wide variety of roles from Shakespeare to modern drama, and appeared in musicals including Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Grease, Hair and Godspell. Peter has also been seen on television in much-loved shows such as Doctor Who, Allo Allo and Blake's Seven.

As a director and producer, Peter has created more than 70 productions, ranging from pantomimes and Shakespeare to large-scale musicals. He has worked with many well-known names from stage and screen and even produced Disney's first pantomime for television. His directing credits include One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, Romeo and Juliet, Macbeth and musical productions at the London Palladium and Theatre Royal Drury Lane.

Peter is especially proud of the original musicals he has written and staged, such as Strawberry Fields Forever and Hazlewood - Legends of the Castle. These productions brought together hundreds of performers, won awards and even travelled internationally. He continues to create new projects and events, always aiming to inspire and bring people together through performance.

Alongside his theatre work, Peter is also a British and International adjudicator, having judged festivals across the UK and overseas. He is passionate about encouraging young performers and finding new ways to introduce them to festivals. When not in a theatre, Peter enjoys time with his wife Anna, their three children and their dog Benji, and is a loyal Spurs supporter with a well-known love of egg and chips!

For your entry, please send clear, complete copies of your chosen pieces to the Speech Co-ordinator using the online entry system.

The Don Valley Festival has partnered with the Authors Licensing and Collecting Society (ALCS). This means you do not need to obtain copyright permission for poetry, prose, or solo dramatic performances lasting under 10 minutes. By taking part, you are directly supporting and compensating

Please note that duologues are not covered by this authors. agreement. Performers must secure copyright permission for these pieces at the time of entry.

To qualify for copyright indemnity, performers • Announce the title and author for all dramatic must:

- items at the beginning of the performance.
- Present the work as written, without altering the words or the gender of the characters.

Allow the words of the poem to speak for themselves. Use only small, natural movements if they truly add to the meaning. Too much action can distract from the power of the poetry, so it is often best to keep gestures minimal. Focus on varying your tone to keep the performance engaging, but avoid exaggeration, as overacting can make the reading feel less authentic.



### NADIA HINSON, ARAM, GRSM HONS, LRAM, LTCL, ROYAL SOCIETY OF MUSICIANS

Nadia graduated from the Royal Academy of Music after having studied the violin with Manoug Parikian and the piano with Jean Harvey. She was awarded first prize for Aural studies and her quartet won the string chamber prize in her final year. Nadia was the featured soloist playing the Lark Ascending and Bach double violin concerto for the Benslow Trust at St. James' Piccadilly having been awarded an instrument to continue her studies. Other concertos in her repertoire include performances of the Mendelssohn, Mozart no.3 and 4, Haydn in C, De Beriot, Viotti, and works by Beethoven and Finzi.

She began her career as a freelance violinist playing in many London based orchestras. As an accompanist to singers and instrumentalists, she met her musician husband Nigel and together they founded the Veloce Ensemble (string quartet and clarinet quintet) touring throughout Britain performing specially commissioned works for that genre. Appearances at festivals and stately homes inspired a regular concert series at Belvoir Castle and Holmepierrepont Hall. As a recitalist on violin and piano throughout the East Midlands, Nadia has been highlighted in festivals and BBC features locally.

She is also currently the owner and director of the Hinson School of Music in Nottingham, and is an International examiner for the ABRSM, a Jazz examiner for the ABRSM, an adjudicator for the British and International federation of Festivals, and a member of the Royal Society of Musicians.

Nadia has been a senior consultant for the LEAD Academy trust, involved in developing music departments in schools in Nottinghamshire, and leading workshops to encourage and involve as many youngsters as possible in experiencing music and the arts in large scale productions and showcase concerts. She has set up composition workshops to inspire children to explore feelings and ideas through music and is a mentor for the Trust to develop self-confidence and communication through learning and performance.

In 2025, Nadia became an Associate of The Royal Academy of Music (ARAM) for her significant contribution and services to music education.



### ADRIAN GOSS, BMUS(HON) (DUNELM), ARAM, GRSM, FTCL, LRAM, LGSM, ARCO(CHM)

Tenor soloist, vocal coach and teacher, pianist, organist and choral director, Adrian studied piano and clarinet at the Royal Academy of Music and singing with Arthur Reckless at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama, later with Ian Partridge, Ron Morris and Paul Farrington. He is also a graduate of the University of Durham.

After an initial career as accompanist and clarinettist, he quickly established himself as a Tenor, enjoying a solo career in concert and recital over 35 years. His work as a singer has included recordings and broadcasts and in 1999 Adrian was awarded the ARAM, an honour granted to past students of the Academy who have achieved distinction in the profession. A former Lay-clerk at Ely Cathedral, deputy Vicar Choral at St Paul's Cathedral, deputy Lay Vicar at Westminster Abbey and deputy Gentleman of HM Chapel Royal, Adrian is Director of the Chamber Choir Quorum, Director of Music and Organist at a major church, and continues a parallel career in education.

Formerly a Director of Music at two independent senior schools, Adrian was Director of the Kent Music Academy for the gifted and talented, and Head of Kent's County Groups where he conducted orchestras and bands at county level and summer schools. He examined for grades and diplomas for 15 years with the Guildhall, and has taught singing for over 20 years in both independent and state schools, including Brighton College, Cranleigh School and The Judd School, Tonbridge. Many of his pupils have gone on to study at conservatoires, won choral scholarships, and currently sing in the National Youth Choirs. His pedagogy reflects current practice informed by ongoing research, and he is increasingly in demand as a vocal troubleshooter. Adrian also directs workshops and masterclasses, and is a member of the Association of Teachers of Singing (AOTOS), a Fellow of the Independent Society of Musicians (ISM), a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, and a Member of the Royal Society of Musicians.

An Adjudicator at international, national and local festivals, including the National Festival of Music for Youth, Adrian is both a Generalist Adjudicator and a Specialist in vocal and choral, woodwind, piano and organ with 37 years' experience. A Federation Adjudicator since 1983, he was elected to the Adjudicators Council in 2010, became Vice Chair in 2012, and served as Chair for ten years until 2024. He instigated and led the development of the Federation's New Marking Scheme and the revision of the Potential New Adjudicator assessment process. He continues to serve on the PNA Panel and as a Mentor. In 2024, his contribution was recognised by election as an Adjudicator Fellow of the British & International Federation of Festivals.
